CLOSING NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR HEIDI SNAREY

As I look back on the past year, I feel truly honored to share the meaningful journey our organization has undertaken to provide powerful advocacy and foster connections for vulnerable children and families. The support of our local community, business owners, individuals and partner organizations have been the cornerstone by which our mission has been achieved this year.

As the Director of CASA, I am passionate about raising awareness of our mission and the vital role CASA volunteers play. CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocates. We recruit, train, and support dedicated community volunteers who advocate for children who have experienced abuse or neglect. When families enter the child welfare system, Juvenile Court Judges appoint a CASA volunteer to be the voice of the child's best interest—someone who gets to know the children and families, gathers essential information, and makes informed recommendations to the court.

The Impact of a Casa Volunteer

Words cannot fully express my gratitude for the incredible dedication of our volunteers. They embody kindness, generosity, and a commitment that profoundly impacts our children, families, and community. I see our volunteers balancing their own families, jobs, and responsibilities while taking on this demanding and emotionally charged role. Their responsibilities include meeting with assigned children monthly, interviewing family members, teachers, and service providers, gathering records, and attending relevant meetings to build a comprehensive understanding of each child's situation. They then compile this information into formal court reports, diligently serving as "the eyes and ears of the Court" and advocating fiercely for these children.

National CASA research shows that children with a CASA volunteer experience better educational outcomes, change foster homes less frequently, spend less time in foster care, and achieve permanent homes more quickly compared to those without a CASA. This data reinforces what I witness every day: a CASA volunteer profoundly impacts the lives of children and families affected by abuse or neglect. They provide a consistent, caring adult presence during a challenging time, fostering important relationships.

The Community

I am deeply grateful for the generosity of our donors, which enables us to secure essential resources, provide training for our advocates, and develop new initiatives to enhance our impact. I am eager to continue collaborating with our community to ensure that no child faces the challenges of abuse and neglect alone. Together, we are making a lasting difference in the lives of the children and families we serve. Thank you for being an essential part of this organization and for walking with me on this journey.
