

- Outreach and Education: We continued to engage in outreach and educational programs to raise awareness about child abuse and neglect in our community. Our efforts have led to a greater understanding of the issues at hand and a stronger commitment to protecting our children.
- Funding and Support: We are grateful for the support of our donors, partners, and the community at large. Your generosity has allowed us to expand our reach and make a positive impact on more children's lives.
- Collaborations: We strengthened our collaborations with local agencies, legal authorities, and child
 welfare professionals to ensure a coordinated and effective response to the needs of the children







CLOSING NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

HEIDI SNAREY

As we reflect on the past year, we are honored to share the impactful journey we've undertaken in our mission to provide compelling advocate voices and promote meaningful community connections for our vulnerable children and families. Your unwavering commitment to CASA of Forsyth County has been the driving force behind our achievements. As Director of CASA, I love sharing about what CASA does and educating the community on how important a CASA volunteer is. CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocates. We recruit, train, and support community volunteers who serve as advocates for children who have experienced abuse or neglect. When families enter the child welfare system, the Juvenile Court Judges appoint a CASA to be the voice of best interest -someone to get to know the children and families, to gather information, and to make recommendations to the court about what should happen in their lives.

There are no words that can express gratitude for the amazing hard work both our staff and volunteers do daily. They are truly special, kind, giving, and make a huge impact on our children, families and community. Our volunteers often juggle their own families, jobs, and responsibilities while serving in this time consuming and emotionally taxing role. CASA responsibilities include meeting with their assigned children every month; interviewing families, teachers, and service providers; gathering records; and attending any relevant meetings to gain the best understanding of the child's situation and compiling that information with recommendations into a formal court report. Our volunteers work diligently to be "the eyes and ears of the Court," and take advocating for these children very seriously.

The CASA office has just seven staff, including myself. CASA staff see their most important role as serving the volunteers by giving support and guidance. Our staff pour themselves into this role by being there every step of the way for our volunteers throughout the life of the case.

The Impact of a Casa Volunteer

National CASA research shows children with a CASA volunteer do better educationally, change foster homes less often, spend less time in foster care, and achieve a permanent home more quickly as compared to those without a CASA. This data only confirms what I have seen in practice, a CASA volunteer has a huge impact on children who have experienced abuse or neglect as well as their families. CASA volunteers are a consistent, caring adult investing in a relationship with the children after and during a very difficult time.

The Community

Financially, we are grateful for the generosity of our donors enabling us to ensure funds go towards essential resources, training for our advocates, and the development of new initiatives to enhance our impact. As we move forward, our commitment to advocacy and the well-being of every child who has experienced abuse and neglect remains our focus. We look forward to the continued support of our community to ensure no child faces the challenges of abuse alone. Together, we are making a lasting difference in the lives of the children and families we serve. We could not do this work without your support. Thank you for being a part of this organization and walking with us on this journey.
